

Before company registration:

Write a <u>business plan</u> (if applicable for new ventures)
Pick a <u>unique company name</u>
Research, compare + <u>choose service providers</u>
(you will need at least one to be a contact person + legal address in Estonia)



Company registration:

Choose a suitable <u>form of business</u>

(<u>OÜ</u> is most popular)
Select main <u>field of business activity</u>

Indicate <u>contact person</u> + legal address in Estonia

Also indicate <u>foreign address</u> of management board

Pay the state fee €265

Decide + submit articles of association

Digitally sign registration by all shareholders + directors

Checklist for e-residents creating companies





After company registration:

Apply for <u>business account</u> with a fintech or bank in Europe Obtain <u>business licence</u> (for certain business activities) Disclose <u>ultimate beneficial owners</u> in Business Register Make or defer <u>share capital contribution</u> (€2,500 for OÜ)





Once your business is up and running, you should also:

Register account with Estonian Tax Board

Register for VAT (when annual turnover > €40,000)

Maintain proper accounting + bookkeeping procedures

Grant permission to your accountant to act on behalf of your company for accounting + tax purposes (if applicable)

Be aware of rules regarding distribution of dividends

Make share capital contribution (if previously deferred)

Declare taxes online at e-MTA on a monthly basis

(if applicable for corporate taxes, payroll taxes, VAT)

Submit Annual Report (due 6 months after year-end)

Disclose any changes to shareholders + directors

If you have staff in Estonia, register them for tax purposes

Keep an inventory of your company's intellectual property

Purchase domain names

Register any necessary <u>trademarks</u>, <u>patents or designs</u>
Read <u>European GDPR</u> + appoint data protection
officer if processing personal data is part of your
core business



General responsibilities of e-residents:

Keep <u>Digital ID</u> Card safe + PIN codes confidential + secure Ensure your Digital ID Card is up-to-date Apply for a new card at least 3 months before expiry Check you have installed the latest ID software
